# JAR OPENER

FINISHED SIZE: 6" square

MATERIALS		CUT FABRICS
	Fabric	• 2—6½" squares
	Non-slip drawer liner	• 1—6½" square

## GETTING STARTED


Read all instructions first.

Sew with right sides together and using a ¼" seam unless otherwise stated.


Before sewing, check *HHStitches.com* for pattern corrections. If you purchased the pattern after the correction date listed on the website, your pattern has already been updated.

## ASSEMBLE THE JAR OPENER


**1.** Layer one fabric 6½" square with right side up, one non-slip drawer liner 6½" square, and one fabric 6½" square with right side down. Pin or clip in place. Sew together using a seam allowance slightly larger than ¼", backstitching at the beginning and end and leaving a 3" opening on the bottom edge.



**2.** If desired, trim the excess fabric from each corner to prevent bulk, making sure not to cut into the stitching.



**3.** Turn the jar opener right side out through the opening. Push out the corners. Press from the fabric side (the non-slip liner may melt if exposed to direct heat). Fold the raw edges of the opening in ¼", then topstitch all edges to close the opening. Stitch an X through the center to hold the layers together, backstitching at the beginning and end.



## SEWING TIPS

Some machines may struggle to sew through the thick layers of this project. Test sewing on scraps before starting your project.

These techniques may help make sewing easier:

- Use a walking foot on your machine.
- Lengthen your stitch length.
- Increase your upper thread tension.
- Sew with the fabric side on top, so your machine's foot doesn't get stuck on the non-slip liner.
